(Mr. Strand) started by saying that some 200 plates had been let which was the most in our history, some were in need of improvement but on the entrance road was being put in hand by Mr. Martin. Parvish Council they had asked us to contribute that the committee had declined it not being our responsibility. Our interest roadways are soon to receive stone loads of charcoal. After then word from Martin Parish Council disappointed over our attitude over roadways to which they were giving \$500.00. Mr. Strand then spoke about included about 2000 slumming 1976. There would be a longer range of fertilizers and others would be taken. Also time and materials would be available.

The duplicates on slumming up roadways and giving plates, Mr. Strand said that some plates were 10 plate plus and some 10 plate minus.

Mr. Strand also spoke further on the next work not being up to date with relative correct addresses that progress was

being made with this.

Mr. Smith asked if we were contemplating the trade description act by leaving a 10 pole plot that is not 10 pole. Mr. Strand replied that a pole is a linear measurement if we were letting plots as 10 square pole we would be wrong. Mr. Webb spoke on plots and said they were all rigs and shapes rather like the human form.

Mr. H. Jones then said from the floor that the plot rigs were more or less so marked out by the city architect originally and the rigs of plots was not a reflection on past members or past committee men. Mr. Webb said he met this and it was not his wish to suggest otherwise.

Mr. Jones proposed that plots in future be set as a plot and not by 10 or 5 pole seconded by Mr. D. Hoag.

Mr. Jones proposed that an amendment be added that plots should be set as plots or half plots seconded by Mr. Barclay. Mr. Perkins then spoke and said Mr. Strand was Federation Secretary and on authority also said that we are not contemplating any act and would it not be as well to leave well alone.

Councillor Stanford then advised us that Mr. Strand table this matter up with the Federation legal people so this would affect all allotment associations. As a result of this both proposal and amendment were withdrawn.

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Councillor Stenford chairman of the
allotment sub committee then addressed
the meeting back of money for allotments
during the main scheme. - After a
vote of thanks to councillor Stenford
proposed by Mr Smith and seconded
by Mr A. Perkins and carried.
