Minutes read. Motion to amend the
minutes proposed by Mr Strand
seconded but Stone saying they
were accurate but incomplete in that
no decision has been taken as to the
date to obtain the Charter. Mr Perkins
said this was not so and completely
killed the minute if agreed.

It was put to the vote and carried
that the minutes be amended.
Now proposed as a vote record by
Mr Giles. Sec Mr Sheehan and carried.

Matters arising

Mr Day (Farm's water) back
of water in lower field plots, allottees nearest
the water park watering any thing and
every thing.

The Chairman spoke generally, proposing
motioning such as if you have water
on a Tuesday you could not have it
on a Wednesday. It appears that
nothing has been done for 20 years or so
it seems. Now we are responsible
after only 12 months as a committee.

Mr Day, said there is no pressure on
the main anything we should have
to increase the size.

money.

It would cost about £10000 to
increase the size to the 8 1/2 ft.

considered.

Mr Adams proposed that we
approach the water board and see what
they suggest with a view to increasing our
supply. Seconded Mr Day and carried.

Mr Stone asked what can we
get from Mr Green? Mr Strand said
Pipe! Mr Stone added that labour
cost would cost us nothing, 3/4" plastic
pipe, 20 yards, I am almost certain
he will supply Mr Strand said, Mr Webb

said the aldermen. - That area could provide the labor to dig the trench.

Mr. Peters suggested a ball valve on every tank.

It was proposed by Mr. Stone that we use the pipe and labor to extend the supply towards Mr. Quinn's plot. Seconded by Mr. Giles and carried, with one against.

Monday. Letter has been sent to Master Parick Council by Mr. Owen stating that binding gravel will not suffice.

Labels have been supplied for marking bottles in the shed sales.

Movers. The old one is to be retained temporarily while the new one is awaiting parts. Mr. Giles is looking into the repair and costs.

Rabbits. No complaints. It appears they have left us.

Shed. Mr. Diamond's plot 82 request for permission to erect a shed size 7x5 with floor. No floors other than solid are allowed. Committee will only permit a 6'x4' with solid floor for which permission is given.

Albion Street

Mr Webb said he and St. Strand went around 197 plots last night and a list was forwarded he hoped that members not so distant would not take offence because he could be stepping on sensitive toes. He then read out a long list each being discussed as he went through them.

Mr Strand produced a standard letter to be sent out. It was suggested though that some amendment may be necessary.

Drainage ditches and spoil from the ditch 197 being used to illustrate the point. Tractors ruining plots while the work is being done.

Mr Green is to have the extra gate post replaced.

Burning off of Road Plot not possible; but burning tyres obtained from a local garage; wire dividers for plots is not as done so cost and encroachment of crops.

and put it into the waste bin.

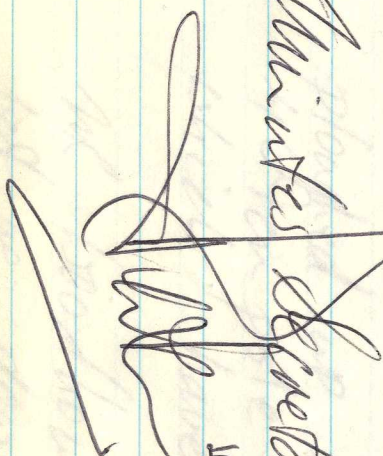
2. And that a complaint was being made
