Purchases for 1975-1976

It was decided to purchase 2 tons of
lime at £75 per ton and 1 ton of
Alumina at £42 per ton. Peat cannot
be brought in at the moment because of
lack of funds. Funds for purchase at
the moment stand at £125
Mrs James asked which was the most
important things to buy at the moment
and was told lime, Alumina, and Peat
in that order.

Mrs Wells stated that a quick sale
is required to get funds back to purchase
other things urgently required.
8-15 PM Mr J. Perkins arrived with
cyrtologies for absence.

It was again stated by Mr. Steward
that lime was the most important
item to purchase.

A general discussion was entered into
on the problem of Clubroot. Mr S. Stone
asked Mr Steward that due to the

cost would it be possible for us to buy Calomel dust in bulk. Mr Strand stated that it was now illegal to sell items such as this in plain bags, full instructions must be on show
