Minutes of the last meeting read and
approved as a true record by Mr.
J. Langford seconded by Mr. Michals
Vote - Unanimous

Matters arising Mr. Strand reported he had
~~presented~~ to Mr. Green of the Will Estates
regarding the selling of two lots they will
not tell us to do so in writing. Mr.
Langford said it was all a lot, maybe
Mr. Strand went on to say that if we cut
our own trees down we may be considered
cut this was not a commitment in
the hope of the estates. Mr. Strand reported
he had written to Mr. Quarry the
Secretary of Western Land Council about
this weeks trees on our South Boundary
adjacent to the representation field but in
his reply he had said he was unconcerned.
Myelapio were received from Mr. Quarry
for the tree trunk on a plot on our
North Boundary but it remained and a
promise that this would be decided up on
the next Wednesday were given after two
more trees of ours would be felled by Mr.

James Friend when this was possible Mr. Pinfold reported that the branches of the willow tree at the bottom of his plot had been cut off and given to a horse owner in the adjacent field for fencing as the horse owner had said that the tree was in ^{his} field. Mr. Friend depicted this fact and produced a map as evidence. It was again emphasized that any tree sitting down by a lotter must be at their own risk had adjacent to site but. The plot had now been pegged out and was a 5 acre plot, the allottee was happy with the situation.

Secretarys Report reported that a letter had been received from our Treasurer Mrs E. Hall thanking the committee for the gift of a turnmille. Mr. Friend went on to say that there would be a few problems this year. The potatoes were in and had been distributed and they were very good also there had been no need to use next money for the purchase of them. There was a good stock in the shed. It was hoped to a lot of improvements this year. Three plots had been let and there were five more to let. Water supply this was on the agenda of the Estates for Thursday.

Rabbit catchers Mr. Friend reported that a lot of attempts had been seen on the site one had said he had been given permission by a local landlord

man with a Stuckell others that had

could it be caught. Mr. Gurney said
it was a problem all around the area
and change was being caused by
people digging out dirt. Mr. Shukan
asked the Secretary who has got
permission? the answer was "no one" but

our rights. Mr. Webb said we must

down taps were best Mr. Smith said
taps for the system would be divisions
