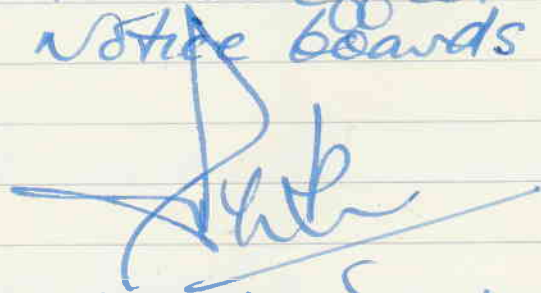
Considerable interest was found in this reminicing, and it was found that Secretary's Honoraryarium had been overlooked last year at the A.G.M.
