Matters arising
Mr Penfold apologized for
being absent on Sunday morning 29th
January.

Secretary's report. Improved water supply.
Mr Stans reported that the city estates
committee have ~~passed~~ ^{considered} this, ~~to be done~~,
Also a fence for our recreation fields
consequently, these items were going through
the accounts department. Mr Curney of
the city estates said he would have some
price for us which will save us approx.
£60. a trench for the pipe would cost
about £120. which we would have to
pay for. The fence is to be the value of
£750 but this is second priority the water
was much more important. Mr Michells
aid the £120 for the trench seemed a bit
high Mr Stans explained that the cost
of being contractors was high Mr
Michells asked if we could dig it

anywhere it was generally felt that help
from Abetia was in general not available
The water supply when installed would
go to the first tap and we should
be guaranteed we ~~are~~ should have the toilet
until this was done.

Treasurer Report

With forth coming expenses it was felt we could just manage out of the rent account. The general account was \$239 - \$96 for bills to be paid. It seems we shall just manage for buying stock this was needed to meet increased demand in the shed e.g. \$50 was taken in sales last Sunday. The Treasurer explained that all things being equal we were short in the shed.

He has Mr Strand explained how he had been showing everywhere for stock as things were spring up as from February 1st. Livingston, we would not be ~~losing~~ buying this as it was too expensive. Beans coming. Limbs, foose fluo, beans and French Beans, bone fertilizer. Bone meal grain more it was felt we were selling most things cheap. Onion sets were coming.

Butter at 35¢ per lb. and flour at 50¢ per pound.

In general discussion about potatoes it was felt that next year we would not buy potatoes early due to the trouble coming ahead and the lack of support from wholesalers.

Mushroom compost from demand we will need a 35 cubic yard load. Mr Strand said he would buy it and sell it at 50¢ per cartload.

Seeds Mr Winterburn would give us some seeds and also sell us a cash register which would be useful.

Any Other Business

Miss Mrs Hall reported that we have
much in our shed, Mrs Howard reported
