

Extraordinary meeting of the Court Place
Farm allotments committee. Held in Montmer
Hall, Old Marston on Tuesday 17th March
1981.

Secretarys Report.

Mr Strand reported a fire
that had destroyed our large wooden shed
and damaged the adjacent buildings.

Mr Strand requested an alteration to minutes
in 1979 regarding the amount our stock
was insured for it was agreed to alter
these minutes to read that each shed
was insured for £500.00 worth of stock.
We were now submitting forms to
the insurance to claim for fire damage
Mr A Smith enquired as to the total
damage. Wooden shed a total loss,
adjacent garage (community building) two
windows burnt out, fascia board and
guttering, one side destroyed some damage
to roof and shelves and stock.

Mr Shahan reported that the Fire Brigade
were recording the cause of the fire
as unknown.

Immediate Plans.

Mr Strand thought we could
one of two things either hire a shed

or close up shop until damage has been repaired. To hire a shed would cost us \$300.00 plus \$11.00 per month, and would be 10' x 12'. Mr Sheehan enquired what would happen if this shed burnt down. It was felt that a small stock would be carried and the Directors cover the cost of the shed Mr Straus would confirm this, also we would not want to be charged the V.A.T. on the top of the hiring charge.

Proposal from Mr Sheehan Seconded by Mr Joames that we hire a shed from Hinkins and Trewin, as a temporary measure, as soon as possible on the condition it is insured.

Date Unanimous

The Treasurer stated that the money for this venture would come from the General Account but we will have to wait and see how things develop.
