Seed Potatoes

Seed collection.

Seed Plot.

At the request of the committee Mr. Maycock agreed to cultivate a 5 pole Plot for the association, for the growing of Yarrowia plants for sale to members. It was agreed that Mr. Maycock should take 50% of any profit for his trouble & the association to take the other 50%, the association to pay for all seeds used, the choice of seeds to be left to Mr. Maycock.

Other Business.

Mrs. Cox reported that the gaps in the hedge in the bottom field were becoming public highways. & suggested that willow poles should be cut & planted to close the said gaps.

Proposed by Mr. Brown that as many ^{as possible} of the committee, should meet on the afternoon of Sunday morning to cut the grass & attend to hedges etc.
