

Minutes of the Court Place Farm Allotments

Chairmans opening remarks

Mr Wheable reported that there was no decision from Oxford city council on what our future ground rent would be. It would not be less than £40-00 per acre. and our future rent should be worked out on this fact. This £40-00 per acre forecast would mean £600-00 for the site. we have approx. 100 members to pay this. The Treasurer Mr Cann stated that this ground rent plus other expenses taken from the rent account meant a rent of £12-00 per annum.

Mr Weiss commented that £100-00 rent for our amenity building also power petrol + Electricity could come from the general account making individual rent £10/11.

Mr Weiss then proposed that a rent of £9 per plot £8-00 for State pensioners be recommended to the allottees seconded by Mr Savin date 11/11/94.

Annual General Meeting.

after discussion Mr Savin proposed that
committee should decide whether to
award a retiring committee ^{person} with a
gift, deciding each case on its merits.

after further discussion it was proposed
by Mr Wern seconded by Mr Shukan.

that a gift be given to the widow
of Mr Alf Robinson to the value of
£50-00 Mr Wkeable to investigate what
would be appropriate in Alf's memory.

It was further proposed that a gift
to the value of £50-00 for his services
on committee be obtained for Mr
Gill Sandy. Mr Savin to investigate what
he would like. Mr Carr proposed
and Mr Worney seconded both
proposals were voted unanimous.

Any other business

Mr Darney complained about a Chinese woman and her dog walking around the site, the dog was not under control and was becoming a nuisance. It was proposed by Mr Lymney and seconded by Mr Darney, That a letter be sent to the Chinese woman telling her to control her dog on site or risk being refused entry to the site Date Unanimous

Mr Carr enquired about our Balance in the General account Mr Wheable stated this will be discussed at the next committee meeting which will be on 18th May at 7-30 pm. in Montimer Hall.
